#### COUNTY OF WETASKIWIN NO. 10 AAMDC 2017 SCHOLARSHIP CALL

The Alberta Association of Municipal Districts and Counties (AAMDC), an organization representing Alberta's incorporated rural municipalities, offers a Scholarship Program in support of rural students attending an Alberta university or college.

Under the AAMDC Scholarship Program, five rural students each year will be provided with a scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00. The application deadline for the AAMDC Scholarship Program is August 4th, 2017.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Be a resident of a municipality which is a member in good standing of the AAMDC, including municipal districts, counties and Special Areas. Residents of cities, towns and villages are not eligible;
- Be registered in his or her first four years of study at a recognized post-secondary institution (the applicant must not have any previous degrees or diplomas). Preference will be given to candidates attending a recognized post-secondary institution in Alberta, except in instances where the chosen program of study is not available in Alberta;
- And be pursuing a course of study relevance to local government and/or rural communities. (This criterion is not intended to restrict eligibility to applicants in only a certain few programs. Instead, applicants are invited to explain the relevance of their intended study program within their letter of application).

Applicants must submit the following for consideration:

- A letter from the applicant, setting out his/her goals and objectives in pursuing further education, as well as the relevance of their study program to local government and/or rural communities;
- Official transcripts of his/her high school marks (note: photocopies are acceptable provided that the photocopy includes the signature of a school or municipal official, along with the official's confirmation that the photocopy is a true copy of the original);
- A brief resume outlining employment experience, community involvement and volunteer activity, recreational and cultural pursuits, etc.;
- Written confirmation from the chief administrative officer of the local rural municipality, certifying that the applicant is a resident of the municipality.

### COUNTY OF WETASKIWIN / FIRE GUARDIANS - 2017

Fire Permits are **REQUIRED** from **March 1<sup>st</sup> to October 31<sup>st</sup>** and may be obtained from the **Fire Guardian in your area.**

(Date of March 1<sup>st</sup> to be effective for 2018 Fire Season)

An application for a Fire Permit should be made two or three days prior to the first day of burning. A Permit will be issued for a maximum ten-day period beginning from the date of issue; however certain conditions may be required in order for a permit to be issued. If an extended period is required for burning, application must be made for another Fire Permit after the first Permit is terminated.

#### PERMISSION TO BURN STUBBLE:

Under the Soil Conservation Act the County of Wetaskiwin has the authority to issue Stubble Burning Permits.

These permits are issued on an individual basis and a site inspection must be performed.

Contact the Director of Agricultural Services, Stephen Majek at 780.361.6226 to obtain a Stubble Burning Permit.

#### YOUR RESPONSIBILITY AS A HOLDER OF A FIRE PERMIT:

1. A Fire Permit gives authority to the permittee to set a fire according to the regulations and the terms and conditions printed on the Permit. Conditions stated on your fire permit must be strictly adhered to. You may be liable for fire suppression costs or penalties as provided by law for any damage that may occur while burning without a permit, or for failing to comply with the conditions as stated on your fire permit.

2. A Fire Permit **DOES NOT** relieve the holder from the responsibility of keeping that fire under control and extinguishing, if necessary.
