GEOMATICS ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGIST Posting #2018/07

The County of Wetaskiwin is seeking a Geomatics Engineering Technologist to fill a term position for a period of six (6) months, May 1st, 2018 to October 31st, 2018. Reporting to the Director of Public Works, the Geomatics Engineering Technologist will conduct field surveys and data collection of County of Wetaskiwin Public Works and Utilities infrastructure as well as post processing and populating the County's GIS database and mapping systems.

Responsibilities:

Those applying for this position should possess a minimum skill set that includes:

- Using a Trimble GPS RTK survey system, organize, plan and collect field data of existing Public Works and Utilities infrastructure systems. Includes water and wastewater systems, roadway and stormwater systems;
- Provide asset description, material, type and condition assessments during field collection.
- Process raw field data into files suitable for mapping and GIS applications;
- Upload field data and populate GIS asset features;
- Review and verify record drawings versus field data collection.

Education and Qualifications:

- A diploma in Geomatics Engineering Technology;
- Demonstrate a complete understanding of survey principles and field applications;
- Able to collect field data with Trimble GPS RTK survey system;
- Competency with AutoCAD Civil 3D & GeoMedia GIS software applications considered an asset;
- Knowledge of GIS shapefiles, feature descriptions and SQL database systems;
- Strong office and computer skills including use of Microsoft Office Suite applications;
- A valid Class 5 Alberta motor vehicle operator's license;
- Able to work in a busy office and field environment and exhibit excellent verbal and written communications skills;

UTILITES FOREMAN Posting #2018/08

The Position:

The County of Wetaskiwin No. 10 is seeking a permanent full time water/wastewater and solid waste Utilities Foreman. Reporting to the Director of Public Works, the successful candidate will ensure efficient operations of all utility functions by overseeing the operation and maintenance of four (4) water systems, five (5) wastewater systems and nine (9) solid waste transfer stations. This position is a middle management position supervising twelve (12) employees. Regular hours of work are Monday to Friday commencing at 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (eight (8) hours per day) with the requirement to be on a rotational call out schedule as required.

Required Skills and Experience:

- A minimum of 10 years experience in Level 1 - Water Treatment and Distribution and Wastewater Collection and Treatment Systems;
- Have a demonstrated ability for being self motivated, organized, safety conscious and a mechanical aptitude with good analytical and problem solving skills;
- Demonstrate excellent communication skills (verbal and written);
- Be able to assess the capabilities of personnel and organize work schedules accordingly;

- Competent in the use of computer systems, programming logic controls and SCADA with respect to pump and system controls at various water treatment plants and sewage lift stations;
