### Fall Graveling Program

Rate payers will notice a change in the graveling schedule this fall compared to previous years. On September 11, 2018, Council approved the rescheduling of its annual graveling program for Divisions 1 through 4 from winter 2019 to September and October, 2018. The County will be evaluating the merits of fall graveling using the following criteria comparing:

- Wear and fatigue on equipment, staff and contractors;
- Mobilization costs between fall and winter;
- Gravel loss due to snow removal;
- Material handling costs because aggregate is thawed, resulting in potential lower processing costs.

Routes are preplanned and a water truck will be available for dust control, if required. The County is also aware harvest is continuing and will work with farmers to ensure their progress is not delayed. Should you have any questions, please contact
