THE POSITION

The County of Wetaskiwin Protective Services Department is currently recruiting for a Crime Analyst. The primary function of this position, through tactical and strategic analysis, is to produce, prepare and disseminate a variety of information relevant to actual or anticipated local criminal activity in order to increase operational effectiveness, prevent crime and apprehend suspects. The position also provides assistance for Policing Services strategic planning by identifying, gathering and preparing information related to statistics, demographics and projections

Regular hours of work are Monday to Friday commencing at 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (seven (7) hours per day)

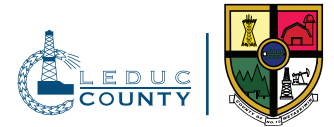

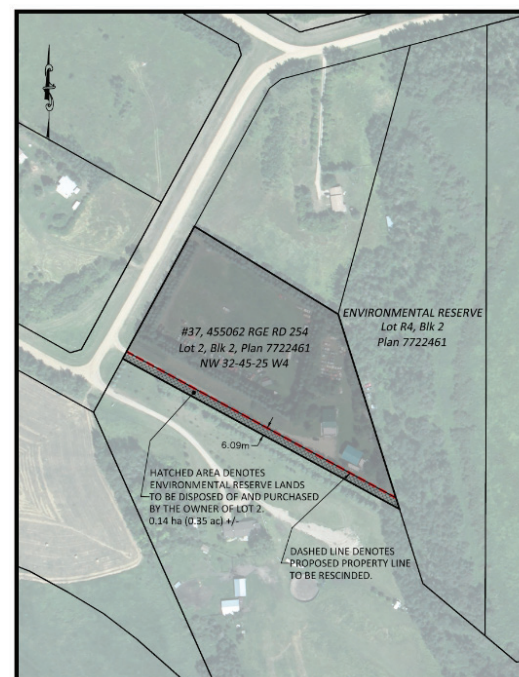

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice of proposal to change designation and dispose portion of the Environmental Reserve.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the County of Wetaskiwin No. 10 has received an application to change designation and dispose portion of the Environmental Reserve Boundary within:



NW 32-45-25-W4M, Lot 4, Block 2, Plan 7722461

If the change of designation and disposal of portion of the Environmental Reserve is approved, the applicant intends to purchase the lands.

Before proceeding further with the proposal, Council will hold a Public Hearing at which any person claiming to be affected by the proposed change of designation and disposal of portion of the Environmental Reserve may ask questions or make their views known. As per the Municipal Government Act, any person affected, has the right to petition this proposal.

The hearing will be held in the Council Chambers, County Office, 2.4 kilometres west of Wetaskiwin on Highway 13, at 9:30 a.m., Friday, February 15, 2019.

Written submissions will be accepted up to the time of the hearing and should be addressed to the undersigned at the County Office.
