AAMD&C 2015 SCHOLARSHIP CALL

The Alberta Association of Municipal Districts and Counties (AAMD&C), an organization representing Alberta's incorporated rural municipalities, offers a Scholarship Program in support of rural students attending an Alberta university or college.

Under the AAMD&C Scholarship Program, five rural students each year will be provided with a scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00. The application deadline for the AAMD&C Scholarship Program is **August 7th, 2015**.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Reside in a rural municipality that is a member in good standing of the AAMD&C (municipal district, county or special area). Residents of cities, towns and villages are ineligible.
- Be registered in his or her first four years of undergraduate study at a recognized post-secondary institution (no previous degrees or diplomas). Preference will be given to candidates attending post secondary in Alberta, except in instances where the chosen program of study is not available in Alberta.
- Be pursuing a course of study relevant to local government and/or rural communities. This is not intended to restrict eligibility to applicants in certain programs. Rather, applicants are invited to explain the relevance of their intended study program within their letter of application.

Applicants must submit the following for consideration:

- A letter outlining their goals and objectives in pursuing post-secondary education, and the relevance of their program of study to local government and/or rural communities.
- A brief resume outlining applicants employment experience, community involvement, volunteer activity, recreational and cultural pursuits, etc.
- Written confirmation from the municipal chief administrative officer that the applicant is resident of the municipality.
- An official high school transcript. Photocopies are acceptable, provided that they include the signature of a school or municipal official confirming that the photocopy is a true copy of the original.

2015 FCSS GRANT

This is a Second Call for Applications, with a deadline of July 31, 2015.

The following guidelines outline what types of programs can be funded through FCSS:

- The program must be of a preventative nature that enhance the social well-being of individuals and families through promotion or intervention strategies provided at the earliest opportunity, AND
- Do one or more of the following:
 - help people to develop independence, strengthen coping skills and become more resistant to crisis;
 - help people to develop awareness of social needs;
 - help people to develop interpersonal and group skills which enhance constructive relationships among people;
 - help people and communities to assume responsibility for decisions and actions which affect them;
 - provide supports that help sustain people as active participants in the community.

Programs and services that **cannot** be offered through FCSS:

- provide primarily for the recreational needs or leisure time pursuits of individuals,
- offer direct assistance, including money, food, clothing or shelter, to sustain an individual or family,
- be primarily rehabilitative in nature, or
- duplicate services that are ordinarily provided by a government or government agency.

LAND USE BYLAW 95/54 AMENDED BY BYLAW 15/10 FOR RECREATIONAL VEHICLE USE

On April 28, 2015 Council amended the County's Land Use Bylaw 95/54 to address Recreational Vehicle Use. A brief outline of some of the changes are the following:

- Three year term Development Permits are now required in some instances;
- The number of Recreational Vehicles allowed per parcel for Short Term Camping and Personal Storage varies by lot size and zoning;
- A Recreational Vehicle may not be augmented by an attached canopy, deck, lean-to or any other attached accessory building. Non-attached accessory buildings require a Development Permit.
- Short Term Camping and Personal Storage of Recreational Vehicles are subject to a five (5) meter (16.5ft) setback distance from any road or street abutting the property exempting back alleys.
