Presentation by Shawn Elgert, Water Specialist, Alberta Agriculture

Planning Considerations: regulatory issues, size, location, water supply

Dugout Design: soil texture, side slopes, inlet structures, wet wells, sedimentation

Construction: pre-construction testing, liners, excavating equipment, hiring a contractor

Dugout Operation: intake systems, pumps, remote livestock watering systems

Dugout Maintenance and Protection: livestock exclusion, fencing, vegetation buffer

Water Quality Issues and Treatment Solutions: algal blooms, livestock run-off,

Dugouts as Fish Habitat: water source testing, ideal water quality, sizing, aeration, predators

Producers, corporations and not-for-profit organizations with an active agricultural business in Alberta and a minimum of \$10,000 of farm commodity production income are eligible to apply to The On-Farm Water Management Program for partial reimbursement of expenses.
