The County of Wetaskiwin has the following seasonal employment opportunities available:

AGRICULTURAL SERVICES

Job Posting #2017/01

Agricultural Services Labourer (1 available position) – responsible for performing general maintenance for the Agricultural Service Board Department within the County of Wetaskiwin including mowing, weed eating, hand picking weeds and general duties as assigned. Must hold a valid Class 5 Operator's License.

PARKS & RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Job Posting #2017/02

Parks Dept. (Groundskeeper) (2 available positions) – will be responsible for performing general park maintenance for the Parks and Recreational areas within the County of Wetaskiwin, including transporting picnic tables, cleaning fire pits, painting and grounds maintenance. Must hold a valid Class 5 Operator's License and will report to the County of Wetaskiwin Winfield Shop.

Spray Truck Driver and/or Sprayer Operator (1 available position) – will be responsible for operating the County of Wetaskiwin's spray truck, performing minor equipment repairs and ongoing regular maintenance of equipment including shop maintenance. Required to maintain accurate records of all areas sprayed, including chemicals used, rates of application and legal land locations. Must hold a valid Class 5 Operator's License.

Weed Inspector (3 available positions) – will be responsible for carrying out weed inspections, grasshopper surveys, Blackleg and Clubroot in Canola surveys within the County of Wetaskiwin. Required to complete thorough and accurate documentation of areas surveyed and draft correspondence to landowners. Must hold a valid Class 5 Operator's License.

Consider how your life would change if you lost your water supply!

Did you know that a poorly maintained water well can put your water supply at risk of contamination and reduce your well yield?

If you are one of 450,000 Albertans who use their water well for household purposes, the key to ensuring your water supply is safe and secure is knowing how groundwater works, learning about your well and understanding how to properly maintain it.

Proper water well siting, construction, maintenance and plugging will help protect your well from biofouling and contamination, save you costly repairs, and ensure your well water yields are sustained over many years.

Find out what you can do to protect your well. Attend the **FREE water well management workshop** being hosted by **County of Wetaskiwin** and presented by the **Working Well Program**, with technical expertise provided by **Alberta Agriculture** and **Rural Development and Alberta Environment and Sustainable Resource Development**.

During the workshop we will cover:

- Groundwater – how it works
- Water quality and quantity testing
- Well protection – protecting your well from contamination
- Basic well maintenance
- Water sampling – how to do it

To attend the workshop, please **pre-register** by calling Heather at the County of Wetaskiwin Office. We will require your legal land description in order to retrieve your water well report from the Alberta Water Wells Groundwater information site.
