#### Heavy Duty Mechanic • Posting 2021/12

##### The Position:

The County of Wetaskiwin is seeking to fill a **0.6 FTE** permanent-part-time Heavy Duty Mechanic position. Reporting to the Foreman of Fleet Services, the successful candidate will be responsible for repair and maintenance of Fleet Services heavy duty equipment and vehicles.

This position is based out of the Winfield Shop in Winfield, Alberta, where the candidate is to provide their own set of work tools. Work may be assigned at the Winfield Shop, Wetaskiwin Shop or in the field as required. A County vehicle will be provided for work assignments away from the Winfield Shop.

This is a permanent part time, 24 hour per week 0.6 FTE position. Hours of work are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (8 hr workday), Monday to Friday. The scheduled workdays are flexible, and are developed to meet the County's needs with consideration of the Mechanic's alternate work schedule.

##### Required Skills:

The successful candidate will:

- Be a Certified Journeyman - Heavy Duty Mechanic
- Hold a valid Class 5 operator's license; Class 1 is preferred for vehicle testing
- Have a minimum of 5 years work experience as a Certified HD Mechanic Journeyman;
- Meet the physical demands of the position;
- Demonstrate excellent interpersonal skills;
- Be a self starter and team player.

Salary is in accordance with the International Union of Operating Engineers Collective Agreement with the County of Wetaskiwin No. 10 for a Heavy Duty Mechanic which provides a salary range of (\$48,430 - \$53,812) 0.6 Full Time Equivalent (FTE) per annum.
